- There is no outside homework required, except to make up for unexcused absences (see below).

Many of these papers contain pretty technical material that some of you will find quite challenging. However, in many instances you can learn a great deal about the paper and its motivation by reading the abstract and/or the conclusion.
- Each of you is entitled to one absence (that is, your first absence is "excused").
- For any absence beyond one, you will be required to submit a (very) brief essay on the presentation you missed. You will be expected to learn the bare-bones basics of the content of the presentation (talk to students who were there, look at the abstract or the conclusion,...) and write it up. I will be looking for a paragraph or two.
- Once you submit this (very brief) essay your absence will be converted from unexcused to excused.
- The sole requirement for passing the course is to make it to the end of the semester with no unexcused absences.
